Headteacher Messages

September seems like a distant memory. It has been a long and busy Autumn Term. We are all looking forward to Christmas and our whole staff team would like to wish you all a very happy Christmas and a wonderful New Year.

This term has been packed with activities and educational visits outside of school. This has all been in addition to our staff and children working extremely hard to cover the national curriculum and to ensure our children all fulfill their potential.

Our school continues to grow with additional children starting all of the time which is a wonderful compliment and testimony to the team here.

During a recent maths inspection our Hertfordshire Improvement Partner came to visit us. She said this is one her favourite schools and she always enjoys her visit to London Colney because she always learns new things. She said it was a delightful visit and the children were all so well behaved. She recognised the good teaching that was evident and that is something we all have contributed to. The findings of the visit were:

There was clear progression of maths across the school
There were lots of opportunities to explore maths learning in EYFS

EYFS was very calm and purposeful with children engaged in their learning

Very strong interactions with children

All staff know the needs of the children well

There was evidence of practical activities being used across the school Good modelling and good verbalising of maths language

Good use of manipulatives

Good models of working walls evident across the school

Good examples of children being able to explain their learning

Agile teaching evident

Maths leader is displays strong effective leadership of the subject

The highlights for me were the amazing Christmas performances and Sing Along's , whereby lots of parents attended to watch fantastic acting, singing and dancing. It was great to see the confidence in our children and the smiles on their faces. Again, these events enrich the curriculum to allow education to take place inside and outside of the classroom. The choir singing at the Christmas Light Switch On was also an honour to attend. I was so proud of all the children who performed in the choir.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all well at this special time of the year and hope 2024 brings you more amazing experiences.

WELL DONE to KS2 for their brilliant Christmas Sing A Long, they worked very hard learning all the words and we hope you'll agree it was a splendid performance.




Our Choir children gave a brilliant performance at St Peters Church this week, it was really lovely.


Thank you for your very generous donations for this year's Poppy Appeal.

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HERE IS A REMINDER OF OUR SCHOOL UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

Our school uniform gives our children a sense of belonging. It is designed to be both smart and practical. It is expected that children attending London Colney Primary & Nursery School comply with these guidelines.

Winter Uniform

- Grey or black trousers, plain black leggings, skirt or pinafore
- Plain white, royal blue or sky blue polo shirt
- Royal Blue jumper, cardigan, sweatshirt or fleece with school logo (logo optional)
- Grey or white socks or grey tights
- Flat black shoes or trainers, no logos or colours on footwear

 If children cannot tie their own laces, they should have shoes with Velcro fastening
- Small plain blue, white or black hairbands or ribbons

Summer Uniform

- Grey shorts or trousers, white or royal blue polo shirt and grey or white socks
- Blue and white checked or striped dress, blue cardigan, white or grey socks
- Sensible shoes (no sliders, flip flops or crocs)
- Hat or cap
- Sun lotion to be applied before school

Active PE Uniform

- Black jogging bottoms, shorts or leggings (these must be plain, no logos or stripes/colours)
- White or royal blue t-shirt
- Blue or black sweatshirt if it is cold (no hoodies)
- Plain black trainers, no logos, stripes or patterns

Important Information

- Make up, false eyelashes, nail varnish, false nails must not be worn in school.
- Smart watches must not be worn.
- No tattoos or temporary tattoos are allowed.
- Long hair should be tied back for safety reasons and to help prevent the spread of head lice.
- No jewellery to be worn, only small stud earrings are permitted.
