Jim Jarvis	An orphan child. The main character in the text
Shrimps	An orphan child. Jim's friend
Grimy Nick	An adult who buys Jim for labour. The villain in the text
Doctor Barnardo	An adult who helps the orphaned, homeless children
City of London	The setting of the story. Capital city of England
Workhouse	A prison like building where the poor lived
Orphan	A child who has no parents
poverty	Having no money or valuable possessions
labour	Physical work
destitute	Extremely poor and not able to look after yourself

## Grammatical Devices and Examples

Main clause	I <b>woke from my deep sleep</b> to hear the cries of children.
Subordinate clause	I woke from my deep sleep <b>to hear the cries of children.</b>
Inverted Commas	"Get up and get working," screamed Grimy Nick.
Synonyms	I felt <b>ecstatic</b> to see Shrimps again. ( <b>happy</b> )
Contractions	<b>He'll</b> never lay his hands on me again.
