## Hertfordshire Improvement Partner, Safeguarding Visit, Report Findings:

- The headteacher leads in providing rigour in safeguarding practice in the school. The culture of safeguarding is strongly embedded and there is the collective understanding that this is a collaborative responsibility.
- All staff have mandatory, relevant, in date training on key elements of safeguarding. The Designated Safeguarding Leads have an extensive knowledge base around safeguarding and related issues which demonstrates the school's determination that all presenting needs of the pupils in the school's care will be addressed proactively and tenaciously. Systems are tight, well-structured and well organised.
- At London Colney Primary School there is an unequivocal commitment to supporting emotional health, wellbeing and high-quality pastoral care, which is underpinned by respectful, supportive and enabling relationships within and around the school community.
- There is breadth and attention to detail in the systems explored as part of this review. Staff know their responsibilities in relation to safeguarding and follow through on matters of concern. They demonstrate the mindset that "it could happen here." During this review, the articulation and evidence of provision was thoughtfully considered, extensive and robust.
- There is rigour, alignment and consistency in all systems explored as part of this review. The Headteacher and designated Safeguarding Leads model high expectations and attention to detail in all elements of safeguarding. All evidence triangulated and provided confirmation of the high standards in safeguarding that are in place at London Colney Primary School
- The staff communicated that the curriculum was well designed to support key safeguarding themes. The PSHE programme the school uses Jigsaw covers healthy relationships, online safety and consent. When teaching about the body the vocabulary of body parts is explicitly taught so that there is precision in the verbalisation of any safeguarding concerns.
- Staff explained that there is a zero tolerance of unacceptable behaviour within the school. The code of conduct is explicit, implemented and all boundaries are known. Children know that staff wearing the blue lanyards will listen, believe and understand any concerns they raise.
- Support in the use of CPOMS (the recording tool) is highly prioritised. Regular reminders are given and assistance is provided so that all feel confident in recording any concerns. If there are ever any concerns about adult behaviour the staff explain that the lines of communication are clear.
- The staff explained that they have heightened awareness, are alert to the needs of their children and community and know all the established procedures extremely well.
- The staff team explained that they had received training to support them in their knowledge of safeguarding in the school setting. They discussed the annual safeguarding refresher training and PREVENT anti radicalisation. They discussed the Educare training modules they had experienced in relation to Peer on Peer abuse. They discussed Whistleblowing procedures. Expectations of staff conduct are explicit and well communicated and all staff understand the importance of modelling high quality relationships, interactions and behaviours as members of this school community. Corporate responsibility is taken very seriously.
- Staff know the lines of communication within the school, regarding safeguarding issues, and feel they are very well supported to uphold the strongly embedded culture of safeguarding that is established at London Colney Primary School. They talked about never being complacent and that it is important to be mindful in terms of all areas of safeguarding risk that "it could happen here."



## **Keeping Children Safe**

We are increasingly aware of young children playing games which are not designed for primary aged children. The international PEGI rating gives an indication of the game suitability. Please consider the suitability of these games coming up to Christmas. As well as PEGI age ratings, game packaging also carries PEGI descriptors that help explain the kind of content that might be found in a particular game. Descriptors appear as a set of icons that cover themes such as fear, bad language, violence and drugs.



## Yr 5 & 6 First Aid Training

As part of our work on developing personal development and our RSHE curriculum, Years 5 and 6 took part in First Aid Training this week. The children were taught about the importance of knowing first aid and being able to use first aid in a safe way. Our trainer spoke to us about when first aid may be needed and demonstrated to us how to complete first aid safely. We were taught to use the recovery position and CPR, should we ever need it. We discussed with our children what an important life skill this is and how they may need to use this knowledge throughout their lives. As well as being very important


We still have a way to go though and are busy planning our next event which will be a panto on the 20<sup>th</sup> January 2023. We will be sending out more details soon about how to


